The Aquaculture committee of the Italian Society of Marine Biology is proud to announce the **International CLIMAQUA workshop “Climate change and Aquaculture: effects on biology, ecology and productions”**

The workshop will be held in Capo Granitola - Sicily on **March 7th - 9th 2012**.

The workshop has been designed to promote high-level, complementary and crosscutting approaches. Furthermore, its structure will foster bi-directional dialogue among participants who are invited to play an active role during plenary sessions and/or by presenting their work in the parallel poster session.

#### **Main Themes:**

##### **Effects of climate change on eco-physiological aspects of cultivable species**

*Effects of climate change on physiological aspects of fish and shellfish with particular emphasis on reproduction, behaviour, growth, metabolism and welfare.*

##### **Climate change: ecological aspects and implications for aquatic productions**

*Effects of climate change on the environment and the interactions between aquatic species and their living environment and possible implication for aquaculture with particular emphasis on: i) potential negative effects, ii) tools for prediction in the near future and iii) potential side benefits deriving from climate change.*
